This Month's Speaker kj4rhp

In October, we will review the Tom Gallagher (NY2RF) presentation on "HR 4969 & Beyond". Passage of this bi-partisan bill will remove the restrictive covenant language hindering antenna erection bν specifically placing amateur radio antennas within FCC Part-97 jurisdiction and extending PRB-1 "reasonable protection of accommodation" from zoning actions (specifically HOA's, deed restrictions and covenants).

Names and addresses of Congressional Legislators will be provided. But it is important to mail the letter to the ARRL as they will be making to most effective push.

It is not too late, but this maybe the last opportunity we have.



Repeater, HSMM, & Ham Shack News

Early Efforts on Behalf of "The Amateur Radio Parity Act" H.R. 4969 Bearing Fruit

Initial efforts to secure additional co-sponsors for "The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2014" -- H.R. 4969 -- are starting to produce results. As of August 5, 17 co-sponsors had signed onto the bill, which was introduced in the US House of Representatives with bipartisan support in late June. Additional co-sponsors are anticipated. H.R. 4969 would call on the FCC to apply the "reasonable accommodation" three-part test of the PRB-1 federal pre-emption policy to private land-use restrictions regarding antennas. The bill's primary sponsor is Rep Adam Kinzinger (R-IL). It received initial co-sponsorship from Rep Joe Courtney (D-CT), who attended the ARRL National Centennial Convention on July 19 to discuss the measure with visitors and League officials.

"With Congress on break for August, we are encouraging our members to meet with their representatives while [lawmakers] are home on break in their districts, and urge their support for H.R. 4969," said ARRL Regulatory Information Manager Dan Henderson, N1ND. "We're very pleased with the initial response, but the more noise we make, the better our chances." He emphasized that a successful outcome requires as many cosponsors as possible, and that's where ARRL members come into play in their role as voters and constituents.

The League's H.R. 4969 page contains information and guidance for clubs and individuals promoting efforts to gain co-sponsors for the measure by contacting their members of Congress. The web page includes a sample letter to a member of Congress and a list of "talking points." For in-person visits, the League recommends organizing small teams of knowledgeable, articulate radio amateurs to approach lawmakers one to one to plead their case.

The limited PRB-1 pre-emption currently applies only to state and municipal land-use ordinances. The FCC has indicated its reluctance to provide the same legal protections from private land-use agreements -- often called covenants, conditions, and restrictions or CC&Rs -- without direction from Congress.

H.R. 4969 has been referred to the House Energy and Commerce Committee. Rep Greg Walden, W7EQI (R-OR), chairs that panel's Communications and Technology Subcommittee, which will consider the measure. The League had approached Walden, who helped to engineer the bill.

Henderson said that in response to the "Get Behind H.R. 4969" effort at the Centennial Convention and last month's edition of the Legislative Update Newsletter, more than 2000 individuals drafted letters to their congressional representatives, urging them to co-sponsor the bill. He asked League members to e-mail or mail letters directed to their US House of Representatives member to ARRL Headquarters for forwarding. E-mails will be printed beforehand, he noted. Henderson explained that this approach speeds delivery, since individual pieces of mail to members of Congress are scanned for threats. Henderson said he's already received another 200 or so letters to forward to House members.

JOTA Jamboree On the Air and the Club ^{ko4xl}

Jamboree On The Air (JOTA) is a major annual Scouting event held world-wide. On the third weekend in October, Amateur Radio Operators and Scouting youth in each country join up to enable the Scouts to reach out via ham radio to their counterparts in other countries locales, share Scouting experiences and make new friends. Every country which has a Scouting program and allows third-party traffic participates in JOTA, making it the largest annual Scouting event in the world. This year's event will take place starting Friday evening, October 17th at 6pm local time and last until Sunday morning, October 19th, at midnight local time.

BRARA has a long history of supporting JOTA. In 2011 and 2012, BRARA hosted Boy Scout Troop 306 at our shack on JOTA In 2013 and again weekend. this year, we are supporting Gulf Stream Council in their annual JOTA campout. Every year it has been a rewarding experience for Scouts and club members alike. Contacts have included Boy Scouts of America headquarters, Boy Scout camps encampments, military bases hosting Boy Scout troops and even the MARS station at The Pentagon. (They were operating on amateur frequencies at the time and hosting a local Cub Scout troop!)

This year, active Scouters in three South Florida radio clubs (including our own) have combined forces to support Gulf Stream Council's JOTA event, which will be held at Tanah Keeta Scout Reservation in Tequesta. The event will include Scouts and Scouters from throughout Gulf Stream Council, the BSA governing body for the area spanning from Palm Beach County through Indian River County.

Each radio club is providing a station and a team of operators to establish and manage the stations and assist the Scouts in making contacts. Between 100 and 200 Scouts are expected to attend. In addition to operating JOTA, the youth will a weekend camping experience and the opportunity to study and earn one of five different merit badges. Laurel VEC testing session will be held on Sunday morning for any youth who are ready to obtain their own radio license.

Not only is BRARA providing a station for the weekend campout at Tanah Keeta Scout Reservation, but we have also invited several local groups of Cub Scouts to participate at our While we cannot own shack. provide the full experience of a weekend at Scout camp, it is certain to be an exciting experience for these young boys to get their first taste of ham radio! Many of us began our interest in radio at that age, so we're sure to see some of these boys (and their parents!) in our future license classes and VE sessions!

Whether you are at our shack or at your home QTH, please listen for and respond to any "CQ Jamboree" or "CQ JOTA" you happen to hear. We'll be using the club call, N4BRF at our shack, and the Scouts up at camp will be using the club call of the Tanah Keetah Amateur Radio Association, KK4OAL.

This is everyone's chance to get a young person excited about amateur radio. It's the easiest Elmering you'll ever do!

JOTA officially begins at 0000 hours local time on the third Saturday in October, and runs through 2400 hours local time Sunday night. A tune up/warm up period is permitted starting at 1800 hours local time Friday, to make test contacts and provide instruction to the youth. This year's JOTA dates are Friday October 17th through
