



This month I want to talk a little bit about all of the language you hear on the radio. A lot of people are confused when they first start listening to the strange new language of hams. Like any new language there are words that you may be confused by or not have any clue what the person is talking about! Sometimes you may get a clue by what the subject is but even that might not help at first.

Most study guides have a list of Q signals. Get to know the common ones. There are also a few general shorthand letters or words that are very helpful. You might not hear them on repeaters but will surely hear them down in the SSB world. CQ, 73, 5 by 9.

All have meaning...even if it has blurred since the 1930's when they were first used. The most fun is when someone uses one of the shorthand items incorrectly. A good Ham will gently correct the person and no offense should be taken! It just makes for a better operating situation for

Do not be afraid to ask what a proword or abbreviation is for. It will make you a better operator and others might have been wondering the same thing but are afraid to ask. One thing that I have noticed in the past few years is a lot of Citizens Band terms have made their way over to the ham bands. While originally frowned upon by the old timers it has now become common. Right or wrong it is just a change caused by so many CBers now getting their licenses and going on the ham bands.

If a term is confusing ask...and today you can look up lists of terms onliné instead of having to rely on going to a book to find them! Here are a few good lists:

Trump Promises **Greatest Propagation** Ever

NEWINGSTEAD, VTNewly inaugurated President Trump wasted no time reaching out to members of the amateur radio community. On Monday, President Trump was the keynote speaker at a banquet co-sponsored by radio equipment manufacturer Peanut Whistle Transmitters Inc. and the National Radio Retransmission Legion (NRRL). President Trump's speech to the 27 attendees lasted a little over three hours and ranged in topics from installing antennas atop Trump Tower to the low sunspot cycle. When Peanut Whistle Transmitter Company's Chief Counsel asked Trump if he had any plans to improve propagation as we approach a new low in the sunspot cycle, President Trump had no reservations in stating, "My administration will bring amazing propagation to all of you. To all American hams. It'll be the best. The best propagation. So big. They'll be so much DX, we'll be exporting it to other counties. You've never seen propagation like the propagation we'll have.


Speaker Bio-Synopsis:

Marc Wohlscheger, WC3W, has been a licensed amateur radio operator for 56 years. He is an Extra Class residing with his wife of 42 years (Pamela) in Jupiter Florida.

He is an electrical engineer with an MBA (secured at Bradley University, Peoria, IL and North Carolina State U). He has had a general aviation pilot since he was 20 years old and holds private, instrument, and commercial tickets; flying every week to Georgia and Florida-just for fun. He is still employed (more like a consultant) after retiring as SVP Business Development for Toshiba's Power Systems Division (steam turbine generators) about 1 1/2 years ago. He consults for another company now where I hold the title of VP Business Development.

A couple years ago he was asked to join a very unique team of amateur radio operators for a first of a kind DX -pedition to Cuba. Under the leadership of Jim Milner, WB2REM, they assembled a team of 7 US operators who joined a team of 8 Cuban operators for a full week of operation in a portable station just outside the capital city Havana. This occurred in the fall of 2015 and included the participation in World Wide contest. Besides operating, they did a number of very interesting interactions with the Cuban people and other hams this will part of the presentation.

This was the first DX-pedition he had every participated in and it was quite enjoyable. The only other time that he operated outside the contiguous US was a full week in St Croix with 2 other amateurs where they did EME and they worked the ARRL worldwide CW contest.
