





Microphones

cense Manual

One thing hams are always known for is having a microphone that is "cool". Today most HTs have a built in mic that is adequate. You can hear what is being said but not with great quality. One way to improve that is to use an external mic.

Some are inexpensive and just meant as a way to separate your mouth from the radio. Others will actually give you a better sound. The problem is too many ways of attachment to the radio.

Years ago you could buy connectors, get the wiring schematic and wire the mic to work with the radio. It is not as easy today but still can be done. First you want to know if the mic is compatible with the radio. Next is getting a connector that will fit the radio.

For HTs that is sometimes a difficult task. Search online to see if one can be had from the few Amateur Radio dealers left. Once you have parts in hand, take time to solder them on correctly. If you don't own a soldering iron maybe now is the time to buy one.

Otherwise borrow one from another ham. Check your work before trying the mic on the radio. Then do an on air test with someone. Make contact without the external mic and then plug it in to see what kind of difference you have made.

For home shacks, a lot of people will get a really good mic. The same things said above still apply. The benefits of desk mics can only be gained by the folks on the other end, But people are much more willing to chat with someone who has a GREAT signal!

This has been realized by many who work contests and DX. A strong, well modulated signal can be heard above others. So for you soft spoken folks keep this in mind when thinking about what will your next purchase be for the radio you love!

As I sailed around the cape aboard my 37 foot yacht watching the seagulls snap up the mackerel, I realized it's hard to surpass the combined excitement of a stuffed crust pepperoni pizza and RF. But we really think we're onto something electrifying now!"

Here's How You Can Get In On The World Power Grid Chase 2018
The goal of the NRRL World Power Grid Chase is simple - work as many portable stations set up at utility poles and electrical sub-stations as possible.

Then, upload your contact to the NRRL's Logbook of the Globe (LOG). And if you're not registered with LOG, now's a good time to start! It's absolutely free and will only take 2.75 hours to register. Soon, you'll get a postcard in the mail with a password but that's not the password you use to login. So watch for an email blast from NRRL with connection information on how to retrieve your access code and get into the doubleblind Linux server. Then you're ready to start your Power Grid chase! Every new power pole or electrical substation you contact counts towards

your monthly total. And if you set up a portable station and activate a power pole or electrical substation (note: ground rods strongly encouraged) you get double the points!

Each month, you can check out the leaderboard and see how your QSO totals rank among your fellow hams. We'll do all the hard math work for you because after getting set up with Logbook of the Globe - you'll be bushed!

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: Can I set up at any power pole or electrical substation? Does it have to be one on my property?

A: Any available power pole or electrical substation is available for activation.

Q: Can I set up at a power pole or electrical substation on my in-laws property?

A: Any available power pole or electrical substation is available for activation.

Q: How close do I need to be to the power pole or the electrical substation?

A: You should be within 20 feet, unless you are feeling the tiny hairs on the back of your neck stand up then it is advised to move.

Q: I have an electrical power generating dam near my QTH. Can I set up there?

A: We have not yet implemented The DAM WORLD POWERGRID CHASE at this time.

Q: Can I activate the power meter on the side of my house?

A: Not sure we understand the question.


Q: How many power poles and electrical substations are available to be activated?

A: So, so, so many. And you'll find that some are literally in the middle of nowhere! We suspect some hams will drive around the United States trying to activate all of them. But surprise! You can't drive to the South Pole.

Q: Will you have operating awards at the end of the year for the most International Power Grid contacts?

A: There will be terrific prizes available! (Fees apply and do not include shipping or handling.)

Speaker Bio:

Gerry Gawaldo received his Bachelors of Science in Business Administration with an emphasis on Commerce and Transportation in 1971 and his Masters of Business Administration with an emphasis on Economics and Statistics in 1977 from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He is also a Graduate of the United States Army Command and General Staff College (1982) and a retired Lieutenant Colonel. In civilian Life he is a double retired Planner previously working for Port Authority of Allegheny County and then Palm Beach County's Palm Tran.

His interest in Amateur Radio began while stationed with the United States Army Support Command Hawaii, where he was given the assignment as Deputy MARS Director. His boss strongly suggested that he get an Amateur Radio License and he did (WH6IIK).

Upon returning to Pittsburgh, he changed his call (WA3YPG) but was not very active. As a Tech he did join the Greater Pittsburgh VHF Society.

Upon retiring from Port Authority, he relocated to Boca Raton changing his call again (KG4FUR). When he turned 60, his wife (Cristi) strongly suggested that he get hobbies before he retired again. Being a dutiful husband with Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD), he complied. Joining BRARA, he was drafted to join the Board of Directors and was volunteered to become the Acting President. He got his General and Extra Tickets punched shortly. Six years later he called it quits.
